## Educational Excellence Beyond Accreditation

In early 2020, Spaulding staff completed final preparations for the Dept. of Education's Bureau of Special Education accreditation. Through this vigorous process which evaluates the educational excellence of special education programs and services, Spaulding Youth Center earned its third consecutive five-year program accreditation – an incredible accomplishment of which we are proud!



Following this good news, Spaulding faced the most complex challenge the world has seen in 100 years. When the COVID-19 pandemic closed school buildings across New Hampshire, the School at Spaulding developed a plan to deliver special education remotely. Because technology was already integrated with learning objectives, we were prepared to successfully transition to effective remote learning almost immediately.

Mya is an excellent example of successful remote learning. Mya's mother created dedicated educational space and a consistent schedule to guide each school day. This schedule includes digital conferencing with Mya's teachers and staff to provide occupational, physical and speech therapy. She enjoys story time, lunch and even library through digital solutions, and uses the Spaulding Remote Learning Helpdesk if technology support is needed. Although Mya misses interacting in person, Spaulding's technology infrastructure keeps her virtually connected until she can return to campus.



Through the past 150 years, Spaulding has adapted to evolving societal challenges to provide needed programs and services. The recent pandemic is just another example of how Spaulding will continue to support exceptional children and families toward a successful future.
